THE LARGEST TURTLE SPECIES



Leatherbacks feed almost exclusively on jellyfish because their jaws would be damaged by anything other than soft-bodied animals.

In the year 1970

the Leatherback sea turtle was listed as endangered under the U.S. Endangered Species Conservation Act,
